

Some Local Plants And Their Uses

Food Plants

- Acacia sp.- wattles. sap, grounded seeds
- Solanum sp- kangaroo apple- egg shaped fruit when very ripe can be eaten. To keep birds away from fruit, aboriginal people would bury ripe fruit in sand mounds for later use.
- Arthropodium strictum- chocolate lily and other lilies like early nancy, vanilla lily, fringe lily, bulbine lilyall important edible tubers
- Various orchids, especially nodding greenhood (Pterostylis nutans) which are found abundant in sandy soils, have edible tubers
- Microseris lanceolata- murnong, yam daisy, was locally abundant in many areas especially in plains (more than Otway forest) before sheep discovered it. Edible tubers. Most important indigenous food plant.
- Triglochin sp. Water Ribbons. Very sweet, starchy tubers. Found in Bambra Wetland swampy areas.
- Typha sp, cumbungi- edible tubers and young shoots
- Coprosma quadrifida- prickly currant bush- edible berries
- Sambucus gaudichaudiana- white elderberry- edible berries
- Banksia marginata- silver banksia- sweet nectar for drinking
- Kennedia prostrata- running postman. Sweet nectar
- Prostanthera mellisifolia- balm mint bush- leaves for herbs
- Exocarpos cupressiformis- cherry ballart. Edible fruit.
- Billardiera scandens- apple berry. Edible fruit
- Tasmannia lanceolata- mtn pepper- herbal bush tucker plant (no known aboriginal use)
- Dicksonia antarctica- soft tree fern. Pith of young fronds eaten.
- Rubus rosifolius- native raspberry- edible berries

Other Useful Plants

Fibre plants for weaving include-

- Lomandra longifolia-spiny matrush;
- Dianella tasmanica and revoluta- flax lilies;
- Carex- tall sedge; Cyperus- leafy flat sedge;
- Gahnia radula and seiberiana- saw sedges.

Other plants for tying or binding-

- Pimelea axiflora- bootlace bush;
- Gynatrix pulchella- Native hemp;
- Xanthorrhoea australis- austral grass tree(leaf bases produce a resin as glue).
- Goodenia ovata- hop goodenia- medicinal soporific properties
- Pteridium esculentum- austral bracken fern, insect bites
- Zieria arborescens- stinkwood. Crushed leaves for headache
- Acacia melanoxylon- blackwood. Infusion of leaves for aching joints.
