Anything that doesn't make it to landfill is fantastic - try to choose products that have minimal packaging or if you can't, here are some ways to recycle difficult items.

BREAD TAGS

Save and pop the collection in the bag at the end of the bread rack in the AB Bakery or at Foodworks in front of Boomerang bags box.

PLASTIC PENS/MARKERS/ HIGHLIGHTERS

Leave in container at AB School reception.



Drop them in the letterbox at 12 Ramsden Avenue (cases not wanted) and we will get them to the Lions depot in Colac.



E-WASTE

Anything with a cord or that takes batteries is free to dispose of at waste transfer stations (aka the tip!)

ALUMINIUM FOIL

collect and roll into a golf sized ball and then place in the yellow bin so the sorting machine can register it

METAL WINE LIDS OR TIN CAN TOPS

put inside an empty can and crush so it can't fall out and then put in the yellow bin

TOOTHBRUSHES/ TOOTHPASTE/ EMPTY FLOSS CONTAINERS

drop in the small, green, marked wheelie bin near front entrance to AB School

SPORTS SHOES (AND THONGS)

Drop into collection bin in SportsPower Colac or visit asgasosinitiative.com.au for more info

COMPOST

Make your own compost system or if you can't - all food scraps can go into your green bin (just not in plastic bags!).



PLASTIC TOYS

Remove batteries and put in your yellow recycling bin.
